## Snow and Ice Removal Reminders

### Responsibility for Removal of Snow and Ice; Time Limit.

The owner, occupant or tenant of every property fronting or abutting upon or alongside of any the streets in the Borough of Marysville is hereby required to remove or cause to be removed from all sidewalks in front of or alongside of or directly to the rear of such property all snow and ice thereon fallen or formed within twenty-four hours after the same shall have ceased to fall or to be formed. Provided: the



owner of a property shall be responsible for conforming to the requirements of this section where such property is unoccupied or vacant or is a multiple-dwelling property, occupied by more than one tenant or occupier; the tenant or occupant of a property shall be responsible therefore in case of a single-unit property occupied by such owner or tenant.

### Removing of Snow from Sidewalks

It is unlawful to place snow from sidewalks or private property onto the street. Deposit of snow removed to facilitate parking: It shall be a violation of this ordinance for anyone to, in anyway, throw, discharge or place snow from the sidewalk or private property onto the borough streets. Snow which is removed from the street to provide space for parked cars must be deposited adjacent to curbing and not placed on the roadbed on which traffic travels.

## Street Sweeping

There will be **NO** street sweeping in January and February. Street sweeping will start in March.





## **Skelton found in Woods.**

While hunting rabbits on the Blue mountain, about two miles from Marysville, on Saturday afternoon, Monroe Whelen, an employee of the railroad shops at Enola, discovered the skeleton of a man. The gruesome find was made in a gully, far up on the mountain side, on woodland owned by Seldel Brothers, where the Big and Little mountains join.

Whelen was poking around an old hollow log, into which a rabbit had run, when underneath the leaves he saw the bones of a human foot. He brushed away more of the leaves and uncovered the entire skeleton of a man. He hastened to Marysville and informed Coroner George W. Gault, but it was then dark, so nothing was done until Sunday, when Coroner Gault and Mr. Whelen went to the spot. Nothing was found by which to discover the identity of the man, or how he came to his death. Suspended from the branch a tree above the log were his belt and suspenders and many think that he committed suicide by hanging, but two ribs of the skeleton were broken, which gives rise to the suspicion that he may have been murdered. The skeleton showed that the man had been of medium height. Small patches of cloth, protected possibly by the leaves, seemed to indicate that his trousers had been blue serge. In a little pile, under what had been a pocket in his suit, was found sixty-five cents in small change and a bill which was so discolored that it was impossible to determine what its denomination was. There was a pair of plated cuff links, and nothing else that may lead to identification. Coroner Gault took charge of the bones and they were buried. It is doubtful if the mystery of who the man was or how he came to his end will ever be solved.

Interesting News Letter From Marysville  
**Marysville, Pa.; March 8<sup>th</sup>**, As the meeting of the town council a resolution was passed authorizing the erection of a borough building. The committee appointed to form plans and estimate the cost of the building re-

ported. Bonds to the amount of \$3800, which is to be the cost of the building, at the rate of 4 ½ per centum will be issued. At the same meeting a franchise granting the Perry County Telephone and Telegraph the right of entering and passing through the town was refused. A petition, signed by the citizens of Linden avenue, asking for a sewer and grading of that avenue, was presented.

The commencement exercises of the local high school will be held on May 7<sup>th</sup>. in the Methodist church. The Baccalaureate services will be held on May 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Evangelical church. There are twelve pupils in the graduating class which is the largest class that ever graduated from this high school; The members of the class are; Mary Corl who received first honor, and who will be the Valedictorian; Dewey Bare who received second honors and who will be the Salutatorian, Hazel Hain, Herman Hipple, Irene Ashenfelter, Paul Anspach, Louise Corl, Hobart Gosnell, Romaine Clendenin, Harry M. Deckard, Marguerite Glass, and Martha Boyer. Class History will be presented by Martha Boyer, Class Prophecy by Romaine Clendenin, Class Poem by Hobart Gosnell, and Class Will by Paul Anspach.

John W. Rhoads, who has been a farmer in Fishing Creek Valley for a number of years, has purchased the dwelling house of H.R. White in Lincoln street. Mr. White will erect a new home on the lot adjoining his former residence. Samuel T. White has purchased the S.S. Stees property in Maple avenue. Mr. Stees has purchased a farm two miles west of town and with his family will move there in the near future.

The lumber, tarpaper, sawdust, etc., has been hauled to the site chosen for the tabernacle. Work of erecting the tabernacle will be begin this week. Dedicatory night will be on Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, The first services in the tabernacle will be on Sunday evening at 7:30 o'clock. Mr. and Mrs. Rev. Hillis arrived on Saturday and will help with the preliminary work.
