Responsibility for Removal of Snow and Ice; Time Limit.

The owner, occupant or tenant of every property fronting or abutting upon or alongside any of the streets in the Borough of Marysville is hereby required to remove or cause to be removed from all sidewalks in front of or alongside of or directly to the rear of such property all snow and ice thereon fallen or formed within twenty-four hours after the same shall have ceased to fall or to be formed.

Provided: the owner of a property shall be responsible for conforming

to the requirements of this section where such property is unoccupied or vacant or is a multiple-dwelling property, occupied by more than one tenant or occupier; the tenant or occupant of a property shall be responsible therefore in case of a single-unit property occupied by such owner or tenant.

Removing of Snow from Sidewalks It is unlawful to place snow from sidewalks or private property onto the street. Deposit of snow removed to facilitate park-



ing: It shall be a violation of this ordinance for anyone to, in anyway, throw, discharge or place snow from the sidewalk or private property onto the borough streets. Snow which is removed from the street to provide space for parked cars must be deposited adjacent to curbing and not placed on the roadbed on which traffic travels.


Sewer Rate Increase

Marysville Borough Council voted at the December 12, 2011 to raise the sewer rates 30% effective April 1, 2012.

The reason for the rate increase is because of the sewer separation project that needs to

be completed. The project is state mandated by PA DEP.





The Marysville Borough Police Department would like to remind residence to keep their homes and vehicles locked. Do not leave valuables in plain sight in your vehicle, including cell phones, IPODS, and GPS units. During recent thefts and burglaries, the perpetrators were targeting unlocked vehicles and homes. Anyone with information is asked to contact this department, (717)957-2616.

Winter is here which means street sweeping has temporarily halted. It has been Department Policy to not issue parking tickets on days the street sweeper is unable to be operated. Tentatively street sweeping is scheduled to resume in March, if daytime temperatures are above freezing. Winter also means snow. Please remember, it is illegal to deposit snow from sidewalks and driveways onto borough and state roadways. Snow and ice must also be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of falling or being formed. Failure to remove snow or ice from sidewalks could result in the property owner or tenant being responsible for the cost of removal plus 10%, in addition to a fine.



Smoke Detectors

"§F-515.0 Single and Multiple-Station Smoke Detectors:

§F-515.1 Responsibility of Maintenance:

(a) It shall be the owner's responsibility and duty to:

- (1) Install smoke detectors when required under this Part.
- (2) Annually inspect said smoke detectors to insure that they are in working condition.
- (3) Maintain said smoke detectors in proper working condition.
- (4) Inform all persons residing in the dwelling unit of the presence and purpose of said detectors.

(b) It shall be a tenant's responsibility in any leased or rental unit to refrain from interfering with the maintenance or proper operation of any smoke detector.

(c) It shall be the right of any tenant in any leased or rental unit to file a complaint with the Borough of Marysville when he or she has reason to believe that his or her landlord has violated the terms of this Section.

§F-515.2 Requirement: It shall be the responsibility of the owner of each residential dwelling unit to install smoke detectors in each such residential dwelling unit as herein provided under the following conditions:

(a) Prior to the occupancy of each new residential dwelling unit.

(b) In the case of leased and/or rented dwelling units within 30 days of change of tenants or occupants.


(c) Upon the sale or transfer of title to any residential dwelling unit.

(d) When there is a structural alteration or addition requiring a building permit under The BOCA National Building Code of 1990.

(e) When a certificate of use is required to be issued under the Borough Zoning Ordinance [Chapter 27].

§F-515.3 Fees. Each time that an inspection or certificate of compliance is executed, as described in Section 6 of this ordinance, a fee of \$5 per dwelling unit or use activity shall be charged. The fee shall be paid to the Borough of Marysville to defray the cost for conducting said inspection and processing the certificate of compliance. The fee described in this subsection shall be in addition to any fee required under subsection F-107.8 or under any other provision of this Part.

§F-515.4 Penalties for tampering with smoke detector: Any person convicted of tampering with a smoke detector so as to render said smoke detector inoperable, shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than \$100."

How many names are still around the borough?

The Duncannon Record and Marysville Journal Consolidated

The editor of the RECORD recently purchased the mailing list and goodwill of the Marysville JOURNAL and effective this week the two papers have been consolidated and all subscribers will hereafter receive the paper in the form it appears in this issue. Subscribers to the Journal will please note that all back subscriptions as well as renewals are to be paid us at the Duncannon office or sent to us by mail or otherwise.

The Journal was established in 1897 by Clarence Passmore. After operating it for one year he sold to J. H. Meck & Co., who published it until 1912 when it was sold to C. B. Smith. August 1, 1922, Mr. Smith sold it to the Newport News and for the past year it was printed at Newport.

With the ever-increasing cost of publishing a newspaper, hundreds of establishments during the past several years have gone out of business, or two or more papers have been consolidated and this as well as other states. Time was with a few pounds of type and the hand press you could publish a weekly newspaper. But that time has gone forever. When we in-

stalled a Linotype machine in the Record office less than eight years ago, it was a first machine in a newspaper office in Perry County. Today no paper's published without a Linotype machine.

It is impossible to publish an up-to-date news weekly newspaper without a Linotype machine and with those machines costing \$4000, together with several thousand dollars necessary for other equipment; they can be readily seen that considerable revenue must, into the coffers of the newspaper treasury to ensure its prosperity. Because of these facts we believe the best interest of the citizens of Marysville and its business concerns will be served by the consolidation of the Journal and Record. 




