Snow/Ice Removal

- Please utilize your off-street parking when it starts to snow. This will allow the plows to push the snow to the curb.
- Do not place snow from sidewalks or private property onto the street. Snow removed to facilitate parking is a violation of the ordinance for anyone to throw, discharge or place snow from the sidewalk or private property onto the borough streets. Snow which is removed from the street to provide space for parked cars must be deposited adjacent to curbing and not placed on the road-bed on which traffic travels.
- Snow and ice must be removed from all sidewalks within 24 hours after the snowfall.



Snow Emergency

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named in §15-703 of this Part, the Mayor, in his/her discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency. Information on the existence of a snow emergency shall be given by the Borough of Marysville through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

After any snow emergency due to accumulation of ice or two (2) or more inches of snow, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated in §15-703 of this Part; or,

To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route, unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains or all season tires.



Marysville Ambulance

To Marysville Borough Residents,

It is with great sadness to announce that the Marysville Ambulance Association will discontinue emergency medical services for the community. Marysville Ambulance has provided service to the community since 1985. For many years, we have struggled with volunteerism and feel we can no longer continue to provide services you expect and deserve.

We have been working with neighboring EMS services to plan the future of EMS in the community. Although we still plan to play an active role in the emergency care, we will rely on East Pennsboro Ambulance Service, Inc. for their response and transportation services. We plan to make this change on May 1, 2015.

We are aware of the increased time that it will take for the service from East Pennsboro Ambulance Service Inc. and are working on having a vehicle that will respond when there is crew available to start to help with patient care.

Holy Spirit EMS will continue to provide Advance Life Support Service to the community and a Membership Subscription Program will continue to be in place for residents.

Although this decision was tough, we need to ensure emergency services coverage is available for our community 24 hours a day.

2015 Municipal Elections

The Pennsylvania Municipal Primary is on Tuesday, May 19, 2015.

Individuals wishing to run for election can circulate petitions from February 17, 2015 thru March 10, 2015.

The last day to register before the primary is April 20, 2015.

Council members serve four year terms and can serve on the Finance Committee, Sewer and Sanitation Committee, Streets Committee, Police Committee or Personnel Committee. The term will begin January 1, 2016 and expire December 31, 2019.

NEWS

Marysville Borough Council adopted four new Ordinances at the December 8, 2014 meeting. These Ordinances establish limitations on Outdoor Burning, Snow Removal, Snow Emergency Routes, and Noise. Summary of said Ordinances are:

Outdoor Burning is permitted Monday through Saturday 7:00am-10:00pm and Sunday noon - 7:00pm. The fire must be attended at all times by an individual 14 years of age or older. No burn container shall be used within 10 feet of any building, property line, or sidewalk area. Materials which give *off* acrid, obnoxious or toxic odor or emit heavy smoke are prohibited.

Snow and Ice removal by the owner, occupant or tenant of every property fronting streets in Marysville Borough is required to remove or cause to be removed from sidewalks all snow or ice within 24 hours of it falling or being formed. The owner, occupant or tenant of any property on which a fire hydrant is located, shall remove or cause to be removed, all snow and ice from around the hydrant so as to provide clear access by fire-fighting personnel.

Designated Snow Emergency Routes are in effect after an accumulation of 2 or more inches of snow. During these times, it is unlawful to park on designated snow emergency routes. It is also unlawful to drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains, or all-season tires.

Noise disturbance prohibited, no person shall make, continue or cause to be made or continued any noise disturbance between the hours of 10:00pm and 7:00am.

Please contact Marysville Borough Office for a complete copy of the Ordinances and penalties, the above is a summary only.

TIPS and REMINDERS

Borough residents are reminded to please keep vehicles, outbuildings, and homes locked at all times. Do not make yourself an easy target by leaving your property unsecured. As tax time approaches, please beware of scammers. Scammers often call victims claiming to be the IRS and threaten victims with arrest warrants and jail time if money, credit card or bank information is not provided. The IRS **WILL NOT** contact you by phone. **DO NOT** provide your personal information, credit card numbers, and bank account to anyone over the phone. If you think you may have been contacted by a scammer, please contact the Marysville Police Department and make us aware of the situation.

Marysville Pool - Information Sheet

Membership & Monthly Membership Rules

- Family Memberships are limited to use by members of an individual's immediate family which are: spouses, live in companions, children or step children, *under the age of 19 living in the same household, *full time students or active Military included to age 22 (*you may be asked to provide proof of residency or identification*). Grandparents are permitted on the family membership. In order for the grandparents to gain admittance to the pool the grandchild(ren) must be present or a daily pass will need to be purchased.
- Other relatives living with the family (ex. brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, etc.) must purchase their own membership.
- Memberships are non-transferable. Anyone letting others use their cards will face automatic loss of membership. No refund will be given.
- A \$5.00 replacement fee will be charged for lost cards.
- Membership cards must be shown to gain admittance to the pool or the daily admission fee will be charged.

Monthly Memberships - New for 2015

Purchase a monthly membership for June (includes Memorial Day Weekend), July or August (includes Labor Day if lifeguards are available). Prices are as follows:

Purchase a punch card for ten visits to the pool. Punch cards can be shared with friends and family. It can be used any day the pool is open with the exception of pool party fundraisers. Punch cards are your responsibility and we will not replace lost or stolen cards. Prices are as follows:

Days of Operation and Pool Hours

Pool hours are Monday – Thursday from 12:00pm to 8:00pm and Friday – Sunday from 11:00am to 7:00pm unless otherwise noted below.

- ⇒ May 23rd, May 24th, and May 25th 12:00pm – 6:00pm
- ⇒ May 30th – June 3rd from 12:00pm – 6:00pm - If we have three lifeguards available.
- ⇒ June 4th – End of School Pool Party - Must pay to enter pool even if you purchased a membership of punch card.
- ⇒ July 27th – August 1st from 12:00pm – 5:00pm (Marysville Lions Club Carnival)
- ⇒ The day before school starts (the date needs to be determined) the pool will be open from 11:00am – 5:00pm
- ⇒ September 5th, September 6th and September 7th from 12:00pm – 6:00pm – If we have three lifeguards available.

Hours may vary due to private pool parties, fundraisers, guard availability, etc.

Closing Policy

We reserve the right to close the pool for the following reasons: Inclement Weather (rain, storms, cold temperatures), Low attendance (less than 10 people in the water), Emergency Situations, Lack of availability of lifeguards, Pre-scheduled events (private pool rentals, fundraiser events, etc.)

Membership Cards and Punch Cards

There will be no Photo ID membership cards. Each person will be issued a new membership card with your name and member number. Cards can be picked up at the pool when it opens.

Marysville Pool Rules and Regulations

- All persons who enter the pool do so at their own risk. We are not responsible for any accident, injury, theft or damage to personal property.
- Smoking and alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a person 16 or older who will accept responsibility for the safety and conduct of the child. Individuals found irresponsible will be asked to leave the pool.
- No running, pushing, spitting, rough housing, profanity, or lewd behavior permitted.
- No glass containers, metal or bulky items are permitted in the pool area.
- Adult swims: adults may take their children 6 and younger, into the shallow end. The deep end of the pool is for adults 18 years and older. The adult swims are at the discretion of the lifeguards.
- Lifeguards may refuse a swimmer admission to any pool area if the swimmer does not exhibit sufficient skill to insure his/her safety.
- In case of an accident, report it immediately to a lifeguard or the Pool Manager.
- Management reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone with skin abrasions, colds, coughs, inflamed eyes, athlete's feet, infectious disorders, communicable diseases, or persons wearing Band-Aids.
- The cost of any property damage shall be charged to the responsible member, including damage caused by the guest of the member.
- Any member allowing another person to use his/her pool pass may result in suspension of pool privileges.
- Thongs are prohibited.
- All swimmers must wear a bathing suit or bathing trunks.
- Showers are required before swimming.

WADING/BABY POOL

- The wading/baby pool is not under the immediate supervision of a lifeguard. Parents and/or Guardians are reminded that children in the wading/baby pool are **THEIR** responsibility.
- Children in diapers are required to wear swim diapers.
- The wading/baby pool is for children under the age of 6.

SLIDES

- No horseplay, pushing, running or cutting in line.
- You must slide and enter the pool feet first.
- Clear the landing area or exit the pool by the ladder.
- One slider at a time—no stopping.

DIVING BOARD

- If you are using the diving board for the first time you may be asked to show a lifeguard you can swim a section of the pool.
- Only one person at a time is allowed on the board; only bounce is permitted.
- You may NOT enter the water backwards or dive to the side.
- After diving please exit the area immediately.
- Be courteous and patient when there are smaller children on the diving board and in the water below.

Any objectionable activities or items not covered in the above rules and regulations will be judged by the Pool Manager/Lifeguards.


The Pool Manager and/or any other personnel are the absolute authority and may discipline, suspend or dismiss any pool member or guest who violates pool rules. Serious or successive violations may be sufficient cause for cancellation of membership with no refund.




