## Police News

**Attention Parents:** The ongoing sewer separation project has left a jungle gym of pipes, culverts, and machinery throughout the borough. These are NOT toys and could be potentially dangerous to children playing on them. Please warn your children to STAY OFF the equipment and materials.

Summer is here which means increased pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Please remember children under age 12 MUST wear a bike helmet at all times. Drivers are advised to use caution on borough streets, construction equipment and materials has caused limited visibility in some areas.

Parents should not permit their child to go out after curfew. Most kids are monitored by their parents and obey the curfew ordinance #346. The ordinance says that children under the age of 14 have a curfew from 10:00pm until 6:00am and children age 14 to 18 have a curfew from 11:00pm until 6:00am.

Black bears are continuing to make their presence known in the borough. Please remember to bring bird feeders in at night, this includes hummingbird feeders. Trash containers should be stored in a garage or other enclosed area until pick up. If possible, place trash curbside the morning of pick up. This department has been working closely with the Pennsylvania Game Commission to address the bear issues. A proposed extended season on black bears is scheduled to be voted on by the Game Commission at the end of June. The current proposal would include southeast Perry and northern Cumberland counties in an attempt to reduce bear numbers and human/bear conflicts in our area. We have also been provided with cracker shells (explosive projectiles) and rubber buckshot rounds to deter nuisance bears. To date no bears have shown any signs of aggression towards people, however we still recommend residents contact the police department to report any encounters. We have observed a sow with two young cubs within the borough. Please use caution if encountered, do not run, make noise and slowly back away. Remember, it is ILLEGAL to intentionally feed black bear in Pennsylvania.

Street sweeping has also been affected by the sewer separation project. Sweeping is being conducted where practical. Street sweeping signs have been "bagged" in the construction areas. Parking tickets WILL NOT be issued in these areas. If you are unsure if ticketing will occur in your area due to construction, please contact the borough office or borough manager at 957-3110.





# Do You Remember When.....

---

## Rye Township, Grier's Point, Jan. 22, 1900

For several months this community has been alarmed by the presence of some wild animal which prowls around "seeking whom he may devour." Several hunting parties were equipped, armed to the teeth and accompanied by all the dogs available, but the intruder could not be found in the day time and it was not deemed safe to venture too far into the mountain after dark; but one night last week a party was organized to penetrate the forest. They traveled several miles before coming upon their game. The first intimation that they were near the animal were several growls, which startled the company and, I am told, they made for home as rapidly as possible. In their flight the lantern went out, which made their progress difficult as well as dangerous. Some fell over rocks, others barked their shins against trees, others bruised their proboscides and Melvin fell and broke his howling piece. Finally they arrived at their respective homes, sadder but more enlightened in the hunting of wild animals. Some say it was an African lion, others a Bengal tiger, others thought it to be a bear or panther and still others a catamount. However, a few days later Jacob Barrick went in quest of this animal and we believe succeeded in bringing it to mother earth with a well-directed aim from his trusty rifle, but the animal turned out to be none other than one of the small quadruped marsupials which infest this region, via; an opossum.

During the past week the P.R.R. Company has had surveyors in the town and almost every inch of the town gone over. Several rumors are afloat as to their intentions. One is that part of the town will be purchased and converted into yards; another is that a new plot is being made. We can rest assured that some improvements are to be made and to guess at what they may be is useless and a waste of energy. The best plan is to await commencement operations.

Geo. E. Strasbaugh, late machinist in the shops, assumed his new duties as foreman of the shops at York, last Thursday. In the departure of Mr. Strasbaugh the town loses a man who has served it faithfully and well. While all congratulate him upon his promotion all are equally aware that to his place filled in everything with which he stood connected as an active and energetic member will be no easy matter.

Dr. W.S. Ruch has removed to town again from Carlisle, where he had thought of locating. In his returning we are glad to welcome him and pleased that a reconsideration brought him to his Perry count friends.

The Marysville wreck crew was very much in demand yesterday, having been out to three wrecks.

In the absence of pastor, Rev. J. David Miller, next Sunday the pulpit of the Reformed church will be occupied morning and evening by Mr. Scott Wagoner, of the Seminary.

The N.C.R. has begun grading for two new tracks around the mountain below town. About fifty men are now employed and more will be provided as the work advances.

Mrs. .I.W. Buckwalter, of Logania, spent Sunday with her daughter, Mrs. George F. Miller.

(Town and Country,) \*At Marysville, Track Foreman Copp has been notified to hire fifty additional men to grade for two sidings below Marysville at the mountain. The retaining wall around Peters mountain, opposite Duncannon, will be rebuilt this summer. To do this work a new work train has put on the road and sixty men will compose the crew. Considerable money will be spent during the year in fixing up the line and bringing the road bed up to standard.

(Centre Township;) \*John Fleisher, son of Henry Fleisher, of this place, (New Bloomfield) last Saturday made a narrow escape from horrible, if not fatal injuries. They were threshing at the farm in Centre township, propelling the machinery by horse power with several horses attached to the sweep. A portion of the harness becoming disarranged, young Fleisher walked on one of the bars to fix it, when the leg of his trousers caught on a projecting bolt on one of the tumblers, which began to wind and pull him down. The lad recognized his peril held on to one of the beams with desperation. Fortunately, his strength was sufficient to save him, but a stout pair of corduroy trousers, overalls and underwear were completely torn to tatters, and his leg severely strained.

To all of you that enjoy being in or along the river in Marysville, please be advised that there are three CSO's leading to the river. These areas are marked at the CSO and in front of the CSO you will find a large concrete opening and this is the outfall area. Please stay away from these areas as best as possible. Remember CSO is short for Combine Sewer Overflow.


