**Private Party Rental** - The pool can be rented from 7:00pm - 9:00pm Monday - Friday and 6:00pm - 8:00pm on Saturday and Sunday. The rental price is \$175.00, which includes the lifeguard staff and pool usage.

## Police News

School is out and summer is finally here. The Marysville Borough Police Department would like to remind parents that all children under age 12 **MUST** wear a helmet at all times while riding their bikes. Borough Ordinance also states it is unlawful to ride skateboards/scooters on streets and sidewalks. Parents are also reminded of the Borough's Curfew Ordinance. Curfew for minors under 14 years of age is 10pm. Curfew for minors between 14 and 18 years of age is 11pm. Exceptions are if the minor is accompanied by a parent or an adult authorized by a parent to accompany said minor for a designated period of time and purpose within a specified area.

The sewer separation project is winding down, but construction equipment is still present, use caution while traveling the borough streets. Watch when traveling around equipment that may obstruct your view. Street paving will begin shortly, please pay attention to posted "No Parking" signs to avoid parking tickets or being towed.

Borough Council is currently looking to amend the Burning Ordinance. However, the current Ordinance is still in effect and restricts burning to an approved container, covered by 1/4 x 1/4 mesh, 50' from a structure, from dawn to dusk only, and only wood products and yard debris.

Bears have once again made their presence known in the borough. Although we have not experienced as much activity as last year, they are here. Reminder it is unlawful to specifically target feed black bear in Pennsylvania. Bird feeders, both seed and nectar water feeders, are attractive to bear. If you feed birds during the summer and fall we urge you to take your feeders in at night. Our department has been working with the Pennsylvania Game Commission to address human/bear conflicts. Please report any bear damage or conflicts to our department at (717)957-2616.

# Ordinance Reminders

## **§10-102. Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation Unlawful and a Nuisance Under Certain Conditions.**

No person, owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Marysville, shall permit any grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed a height of 6 inches, or to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor or to conceal any filthy deposit or to create or produce pollen. Any grass, weeds or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of this Section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough.

## **§10-103. Responsibility for Removing, Trimming or Cutting Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation.**

The owner of any premises, as to vacant premises or premises occupied by the owner, and the occupant thereof, in case of premises occupied by other than the owner thereof, shall remove, trim or cut all grass, weeds or other vegetation growing or remaining upon such premises in violation of any of the provisions of §10-102.

## **§21-206. Duty of Property Owners Following Notice to Construct, Reconstruct, or Repair Sidewalk and/or Curb.**

When the Borough Council shall order a sidewalk and/or curb to be constructed or reconstructed upon or along any street in the Borough by and at the expense of the owner of the abutting property, the Council shall notify the owner of such property to complete the construction or reconstruction of the same, in strict conformity with the Borough specifications therefore, within 30 days after such notice. When the Borough shall order a sidewalk and/or curb to be repaired upon or along any street in the Borough by and at the expense of the owner of the abutting property, the Council shall notify the owner of such property to complete the repair of the same within 30 days after such notice, such work or repair to be done in the manner and to the extent specified in such notice and in strict conformity with the provisions of such notice. Any failure, refusal or neglect of such property owner to complete such work in conformity with specifications, within the said time limit, shall give the Borough authority to proceed under § 1805 of the Borough Code of 1966 to do, complete or rectify the said work and to collect the cost thereof, plus 10% from such property owner in default.






# Marysville Rye Historical Society



MARYSVILLE, 1861. This store on Lincoln and Lansvale Streets was owned by William Roberts. In 1885 his son, Frank W, joined his father. William stayed on until 1950. Frank moved the business to Verbeke Street and retired from this location. Roy Keller became the owner. After his ownership, William A. Rohrer became the owner. After sometime, William and his wife, Daisy, moved on to start the Big Bee. William (Bill) Rohrer was very active in many civic activities.



"THE CENTRAL HOTEL", Marysville. Marysville's leading Hostlery, a three story frame building with all improvements, was owned and operated by George W. Rhoads. It was centrally located near the Pennsylvania Railroad Station and was torn away to allow for the new highway. Mr. Editor; Having a few spare moments to myself, I thought, as you had no correspondence from this remote part of the county, that a short account of matters and things in general might be interesting to your many readers.

Marysville is situated at the confluence of a stream called Fishing Creek with the Susquehanna River, and although not as beautiful a town as its pretty name would imply, it a thriving town with an energetic population. There are two railroads passing through it, which gives the lower part of it rather a dark completion. The place numbers between 1000 and 1200 inhabitants, but more are almost daily added to the above number by emigration on account of the amount of labor needed by the railroad companies. The Northern Central Company is engaged in enlarging their Round House to an entire circle, heretofore only an half circle, which will then be capable of holding thirty six locomotives. There is also a rumor an afloat that they intend to establish a large car shop here.

## Town Improvements

There are some twenty private buildings going up this summer, one store house, three churches, and one school house. The P.R.R. Co. is also rearing a large three story boarding house, at or near the Marysville Station, for the accommodation of travelers and those who wish recreation from the close and thronged cities.

## Excitement, Supposed to be Drowned but Came Home on His Pegs.

About the beginning of the present month, young Mutzabaugh and his father discovered their boat to have gone adrift in Duncannon, came down the river to within a mile of this place, where they found their boat lodged against a rock. The young man stripped off all but drawers, waded in for the boat and went near it and while crossing a rock he fell in to the water. His father could not see him from the shore and at one came to the conclusion that his son was lying drowned beneath the waters of the Susquehanna and started for home to procure help. The good people of Duncannon soon lent a helping hand and with boats and the necessary implements, started for the place of operation. After working for some time without success, the news reached them that Mutzabaugh, Jr. had arrived at Duncannon with his boat and nothing the worse for the excitement.

Illegal Fishing

Salmon and Bass are Being Caught in Large Quantities.

Fishermen who have no fear of the law are now busy along the shores of the Susquehanna River, between this city and Marysville, and fish by the hundredweight are being taken daily. Drag seines and set nets are the devices employed and black bass, Susquehanna salmon, catfish and carp are the fish mostly caught. The fishing is done principally by river men and farmers residing along the river and their catches are readily disposed of two neighbors and others at the market place. Several five-pound bass, taken in seines, have found their way to this city. Last week a seven-pound salmon, caught near West Fairview, was served on the table of a well-known Philadelphia member of the Legislature. Men who have been seining report the river full of young Susquehanna salmon, from six to eight inches long and large numbers brought up every time a net is drawn.

Fishermen are enthusiastic over the outlook for the coming angling season. They say the river is full of fish, and predict an abundance of good sport this summer and would like the State Commission to take a hand in putting a stop to seining at this time of the year.

Theatre Burns in Marysville

Fan to fury by strong gale, fire Saturday night destroyed the Galen and theater building in Marysville, causing a loss estimated at \$10,000, partly covered by insurance.

The blaze started when a strong win blue sparks from a furnace to the floor of a boiler house in the rear of the burned structure.

The building was by Amos Fisher. Two apartments, located on the second floor with their contents were burned. The apartments are occupied by William Whitekettle and family, who were away at the time of the fire, and Ralph Bening and family. The busy family managed to save a part of their furniture.

Unable to cope with the blaze, Marysville fire fighting forces enlisted aid from Harrisburg.

The one fireplug was in operation when the Harrisburg companies arrived. They quickly put this out of this business and began pumping water from the river a distance of about five blocks.

The theater building; a frame structure, burned rapidly and firemen although unable to save it, prevented the flames from spreading to other nearby buildings and residences.

Firemen put up a stubborn fight for four hours before finally gaining control of the flames.

Fisher, owner of the building, intends to erect a new brick structure on the site of the one destroyed.


