## Marysville Borough News

Leaf collection will begin late October and end in the beginning of December.

The south end (Valley Street to Ridgeview Drive) of the borough will be collected on Mondays and Wednesdays.

The north end (Valley Street to Sylvan Street) of the borough will be collected on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

North Main Street, South Main Street and the adjoining streets will be collected on Fridays.



If your street was not collected on your designated day due to inclement weather, the leaves will be collected on Friday.

If you live on Valley Street, please call the borough office at 957-3110 to have your leaves put on the

schedule to be picked up. Where possible, without blocking lanes, place leaves on street pavement. Where curbs are present. Keep a foot of pavement cleared between curb and leaf piles. Be sure that only leaves are in the piles. Sticks, rocks pieces of wood and other debris can cause serious damage to the collection equipment and will not be picked up.

There will be no special pickups.





# Do You Remember When.....

## **Gunman Holds Up Marysville Bank; 40-Mile-Area Roadblocks Set Up Debonair Bandit Takes \$7,524, Escapes in Car**

**MARYSVILLE, Oct. 9**—A debonair gunman, armed with a nickel-plated revolver, robbed the First National Bank of Marysville of \$7,524 this afternoon. State and local police early yesterday were manning roadblocks within a 40-mile radius of this community. They were stopping all cars, believing the fugitive might have changed getaway cars. State Police Cpl. Alfred J. Corkran, Harrisburg Barracks, said the man fled town in a late model, yellow Studebaker. Corkran said the robber threatened to kill three bank employees if they tried to follow him or call police "before ten minutes are up."

### **CHAHIER IGNORES THREAT**

Kenneth C. Toomey, assistant cashier, ignored the threat and telephoned police as soon as the gunman left the bank. He also called Marysville Police Chief William Sheppard. Within 10 minutes, road blocks had been thrown up on all major highways. Mrs. Mildred Hoffman and Marion E. Biting, bookkeepers, were in the bank with Toomey, Corkran said. The described the man as stocky, about 50, six feet tall and weighing around 200 pounds. He was wearing a dark blue suit, a large shirt, a gray felt hat, buff colored shoes with crepe soles and dark-rimmed glasses, according to Corkran. The robber came into the bank yesterday and asked Toomey if he knew the whereabouts of a man from Duncannon. Toomey didn't. He returned today, shortly before 2 p.m. when the bank closes, and told Toomey he'd found the man, Corkran reported.

### **HANDED CASHIER BAG**

After chatting a bit, Corkran said, the man pulled out the gun, a .32 or a .38, and said, "This is a stickup." He ordered the three employees to lint up, with their backs toward the front window, Corkran continued, and handing Toomey a large paper grocery bag, said "Fill it up." Toomey scooped money out of a drawer into the bag, Corkran said, and the gunman took it, saying he wanted 10 minutes to escape. He added, "If you don't cooperate, I have a man outside who will kill you. Investigating officers said the gunman overlooked money in other drawers and ignored bags of money in the open vault. The \$7,524 was all in bills.

Patrolman David S. Brady, Marysville said, "The three employees were unable to setoff the burglar alarm during the holdup or make use of a gun kept in the bank. The bank is a block from the main business district. Two school girls, ages 9 and 10, who live near the bank told police they saw a car similar to the getaway auto parked on Lincoln St. on Monday and Tuesday. Police withheld the identity of the girls. Brady said Fred White, a TV repairman, who was installing an aerial on a nearby home, saw a yellow Studebaker pull away from a parking spot on Lincoln St., near the bank shortly after 2 p.m.. Brady said White told him the auto heading north, sped through a stop sign at Lincoln and Valley Sts. and turned east onto Valley St. He said he lost sight of the auto because of a turn in the roadway, but he thinks the driver was alone. Burgess Harry Johns said he was driving along Rts. 11-15, Marysville's main street, about the same time. Brady said Johns told him the auto ran a stop sign at the intersection of Valley St. and Rts. 11-15 and headed south. Brady said Johns started after the auto, to warn the driver about the stop sign violation, but the car picked up speed and outdistanced him. Police said they are not overlooking the possibility that the robber had an accomplice in the car. Patrons of an ice cream parlor near the bank said a man fitting the fugitive's description came in earlier today with a companion. They described the companion as a man about 40, slender, wearing a light shirt and coat. Corkran said the FBI was called into the case, because the bank is a member of the Federal Reserve System. The bank was dusted for fingerprints. The employees said the man was not wearing gloves. Police tonight were checking area hotels, motels and restaurants and taverns for leads, figuring the man has been in the area at least since Monday. They were also keeping a watch at air facilities and bus and railroad terminals.

### **FBI Joins Search For Bank Bandit**

FBI agents today joined state and local police in the search for a nattily attired gunman who robbed the First National Bank of Marysville yesterday afternoon of \$7,524 after threat-ening the lives of a man and two women employees. Hopes of capturing the "very calm" bandit, who escaped in an automobile, were pinned by police on the possibility of fingerprint identification, recognition of police "rogues gallery" pictures and a "good description" furnished by the robbery victims. Whether the gunman was operating alone when he robbed the little bank in the Perry County community of approximately 2,800 residents, minutes before its 2 p.m. closing time, had not been determined today, police said.

### **Guard at White Hill Accused of Robbing Bank at Marysville Police say Cash Found in His Home**

State Police arrested a gray-haired guard at the White Hill Industrial School yesterday and he was charged with Wednesday's \$7,524 armed holdup at the First National Bank of Marysville. Norman Simler Batcheler, 51, Shiremanstown, father of two daughters and a son, is being held in the Dauphin County Prison. Cpls. Robert Smith and Alfred J. Corkran seized Batcheler at the Industrial School about 2:45 p.m., a little more than 24 hours after the crime. Smith said Batcheler was reporting for duty at the time, for his first day at work in two weeks. According to First Sergeant Clarence F. Temke, Harrisburg Barracks, Batcheler signed a statement admitting his guilt and said he was, "ashamed." A tip on the telephone led to Batcheler's arrest, Smith said. Police have promised to protect the identity of the tipster, who had read a description of the gunman and his getaway car in The Patriot. After questioning at the State Police Barracks, Batcheler was turned over to FBI agents. Batcheler will be prosecuted by federal authorities, it was explained since the bank was insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. FBI agents arraigned Batcheler at 5:10 p.m. before U.S. Commissioner Charles J. Ware. Ware said he was charged under federal statutes and committed to the County Prison on default of \$20,000 bail to await action by the U.S. District Court.

### **REFUSES ATTORNEY**

The Commissioner said Batcheler waived a preliminary hearing and when asked if he wanted to get an attorney, he was quoted as saying, "No I've caused enough trouble already." Most of the loot was recovered, police said. Smith and Corkran said \$7,021 was found in a trunk at Batcheler's home, a cottage at a tourist court here he lived alone. Police said Batcheler showed them where he buried another \$200 near Gettysburg Pike and he had \$33 in his wallet.

### PAID ON CAR

The remaining \$270 had been spent, the troopers reported. Corkran said Batcheler told them he had made a payment on his car, which he used in the hold up, and "paid some other bills." Temke said the three employees in the bank at the time of the robbery identified a picture of Batcheler at the barracks. The photo was obtained from White Hill. The employees are Kenneth C. Toomey, assistant cashier; Mrs. Mildred Hoffman, clerk and Mrs. Marion E. Bitting, bookkeeper, all of Marysville. According to Temke, they will have a chance today to identify Batcheler in person.

### SEPERATED FROM WIFE

Corkran said Batcheler, who is estranged from his wife, told him he planned the holdup a few days ago because he "needed money badly." The troopers said Batcheler told them he put the loot in the trunk of his car after the holdup. He then fled south on Rts. 11-15, turned off on the Summerdale road and headed for a tavern in Mechanicsburg. There the officers said, Batcheler watched the World Series for a while and had a couple drinks, "because I needed them." He then went home. At that time, the area was bristling with roadblocks, set up within 10 minutes of the robbery.

### GUARD SINCE 1953

Corkran and Smith said Batcheler, who told them he has a heart condition, is a native of Phillipsburg. He has been a guard at White Hill since 1953. The corporals said Batcheler told them he went in the bank Tuesday, intending to rob it, but got "cold feet." Instead, he asked Toomey if he knew the whereabouts of a man from Duncannon, Toomey didn't. Batcheler returned to the bank Wednesday, shortly before the 2 p.m. closing, and told Toomey he found the man he was seeking, according to the officers. Officers said that after chatting a while, pulled out a nickel-plated revolver and said "This is a stickup." The three were ordered to line up. Toomey was handed a paper bag, and told to, "fill it up." Toomey scooped the loot, all in bills, from a cash drawer, and the bandit left, telling the employees not to call police for 10 minutes. He added, "If you don't cooperate, I have a man outside who will kill you."

### REPORT GUN FOUND

The two troopers said Batcheler claims he had no accomplice. Troopers said they found clothing matching that of the bandit, a paper bag and a gun in his cottage. The gun, they reported was a .38 and had four shells in it. Smith quoted Batcheler as saying, "I wouldn't kill anybody." Marysville Patrolman David S. Brady, who was at the questioning, said Batcheler told him he picked the Marysville bank because "it was a small town bank." Two 10-year-old school girls gave police their first good lead. They said they saw a yellow and cream colored car parked on Lincoln St., near the bank, on Monday and Tuesday. Temke lauded authorities at White Hill for their cooperation. FBI agents said that if Batcheler is found guilty, he can be fined \$5,000 or sentenced to 20 years in prison, or both.

## Two Girls Praised For Aiding Arrest

**MARYSVILLE, OCT. 10<sup>TH</sup>**—Police today credited two girls with playing a big part in the arrest of suspected bank robber Norman S. Batcheler. Sally Barrick and Margery Sue Snyder, both 10 year-old fifth grade pupils, of Marysville gave police their first concrete lead following Wednesday's robbery of the Marysville First National Bank, when they were able to give an accurate description of the get-away car. Until this time, police have withheld their names to protect them. It is not a simple story of two girls seeing a speeding getaway car. It occurred because of the alertness of the two, in an incident two days prior to the armed holdup. Monday, Sally and Margery Sue were playing with batons and dolls on the sidewalk of the Snyder home, when they paused to watch a man driving a canary yellow and white, auto. The man turned the car, and parked it on Lincoln St. They paused at play several times, curious about the parked car and its occupant. They told police later, the man wore a gray hat and dark rimmed glasses. He looked at them several times, but did not speak. Tuesday the car returned. The girls were still home from school because of teachers institute, and again noted the brilliant colored car. Then Wednesday, while they were at school, the \$7,524 holdup took place in the same block. When they came home, police were questioning area residents. Officer David S. Brady of the Marysville Police talked to Margery, on the off chance that she had noted something unusual the day before. The bank assistant cashier, Kenneth Toomey, said the bandit had been in the bank the previous day. Margery Sue replied, "oh, do you mean the man in the yellow car?" Brady was immediately interested. "My playmate Sally also saw the man in the car, on Monday," Margery said. "In police work," Brady said, every lead is checked out. So I decided to find out all I could." Brady said he knew the parents of both girls, and knew that both girls were "bright." Brady immediately questioned Sally, who verified Margery's story of the stranger in the yellow car. The description of the man giped with that given by bank employees. He took them to a West Shore Auto agency to check cars with our hesitation the two agreed it was a late model Studebaker. The work immediately went out to other police. The two girls insisted the car was two-toned, with a cream or white upper section. The man at the agency declared it must have been a black upper section, as he didn't think that that particular model came with a white or cream top. The two stubbornly insisted. Police were impressed with the girl's positive attitude, and immediately sent out a 13 state alarm for the car described by the girls. The description of the car printed in The Patriot lead to the anonymous tip, and arrest of Batcheler. Further questioning in the Marysville area Wednesday revealed a TV repairman Fred White, had seen a similar car about the time of the robbery, and Marysville Burgess Harry Johns had pursued such a car for a traffic violation, but lost him.


