Leaf Collection



Leaf collection will begin late October and end in the beginning of December.

When your leaves fall you can rake them to the curb. The truck will be around on a daily basis (weather permitting) to pickup the leaves.

Leaf collection guidelines are as follows:

- If you have leaves after leaf collection has been completed it will be your responsibility to dispose of the leaves.
- Where possible without blocking lanes, place leaves on street pavement. Where curbs are present, keep a foot of pavement cleared between curb and leaf piles.
- Be sure that only leaves are in the piles. Sticks, rocks, pieces of wood and other debris can cause serious damage to the collection equipment and delay the schedule.

July 2015 - September 2015

Approved with the exception of Allen Metzger to accept his resignation as Borough Council Vice-President and approved Gary Perry as a replacement for Vice-President.

Approved to award the contract for Refuse/Recycling to Advanced Disposal Services for \$211,658.40 pending review of the contract via Scott Weaver and if needed by the borough Solicitor, Dan Altland. The contract is good for one (1) year with two (2) additional one-year terms by written request.

Approved the 2015 Comprehensive Plan for the Borough of Marysville.

Approved to apply for the Community Development Block Grant of Perry County for paving the parking lot the borough owns on Mill Street.

Approved unanimously to have the borough engineer's, Pennoni Associates to give approximate cost on paving half of Center Street, Catherine Street, Elizabeth Street, Weaver Street and Jacob Street and to have Scott proceed with the advertisement for the Request for Proposal (RFP) for paving the streets listed.

Approved to advertise for a Sewer Plant Operator.

Approved to donate \$500.00 to Perry County Crime Stoppers.

Approved to remain with EMC Insurance for the borough insurance coverage at a cost of \$77,676.00.

Approved to have Cathy Magee keep the office open so the staff can attend the Treatment Plant Operator, Darrel Binkley's funeral services.

Approved to ask our Borough employee's if they would be interested in volunteering with the fire company and responding during normal work hours.

Approved to purchase the belt press belts.

Approved to use \$30,000.00 from the General Fund Money Market account for the 150th Celebration. The money will be transferred to the Recreation account when needed to pay invoices. Lance Barthel asked Kim Charles to check with Rich Stees, chair of the Marysville Park, Pool and Recreation Foundation to see if the committee would be willing to have some of the fundraisers and sponsors go through their Foundation since they are 501c3.

Approved to dissolve the Ambulance Committee appointed by Borough Council President after the meeting on Wednesday, August 12, 2015.

Approved to pay the borough's portion of the grant.

Approved to have Trick or Treat on Thursday, October 29, 2015 from 6:00pm – 8:00pm.

Approved to accept the bid of \$75,075.00 from E.K. Services Inc. for Base Repair, Pavement Overlay, and Leveling and the cost for the following roads to be completed: Catherine Street from South Main Street to Susquehanna Street, Elizabeth Street from South Main Street to Susquehanna Street, Center Street from Jacob Street to Weaver Street, Jacob Street from South Main Street to Center Street, Weaver Street from North Main Street to Center Street Leveling course for Funk Street from Verbeke Street to State Road Pavement for roads listed will be completed by October 2015.

Approved with three yes votes, three nay votes and deciding tie breaker vote by Mayor Deb Troutman to purchase four 23.5 foot Premium Recycled Rubber Speed Bumps and proper signage for the speed bumps on South Main Street during the 2016 11/15 road closure.

Approved the Minimum Municipal Obligation.

Approved to advertise amendment to the ordinance for street direction, stop signs and removal of stop signs.

Approved to waive the \$50.00 zoning permit fee for the Eagle Scout Project.

Approved to a bond reduction for Rockville Estates Phase 1 per Pennoni Associates Inc., Marysville Borough's Engineer recommendation.

Approved to pay off the 2013 dump truck lease. David Magee said this would save the borough over \$1,000.00 in interest.

Approved unanimously to approve to replace the carpet in reception office, Scott's office and records room for \$4,970.00 and replace carpet in the meeting room for \$2,302.00.

Approved with one nay vote to have Blue Diamond Pool Service, LLC resurface the Marysville Borough baby pool for \$5,590.00.

Approved unanimously to hire Dennis Wilson to follow the union guidelines and pay him at a reduced rate of 70% to fill Darrel Binkley's position. Dennis Wilson will have a ninety (90) day probation period.

Police News

Local construction projects are wrapping up. The bridge replacement on SR 11/15 over W. Main St. should be completed by the end of October. The Duncannon Rock Slope Project is scheduled to be completed by the end of October. Please be patient and caution around these projects to ensure your safety and the safety of the workers. The Marysville Rock Slope Project is scheduled to begin in early spring 2016. Tentatively SR 11/15 is scheduled to be closed for the months of May, June and July (90 day closure) between Marysville Borough and East Pennsboro Township. Due to the roadway width and height of the rock walls the roadway must be closed during this project to ensure everyone's safety. PennDOT is continuing to hold meetings to keep us informed about the project, please check our Facebook page for updates.

School is back in session which means bus and pedestrian traffic has increased. Drivers are reminded they must yield to any bus with flashing amber lights, and stop for buses with flashing red lights. Vehicles meeting buses at intersections are also required to stop if the flashing red lights are activated. Use caution and slow down, keep our children safe.

As fall quickly approaches, the likelihood of bear-human conflicts dramatically increases. Bears will be searching for easy, high calorie food sources before entering torpor. During the fall, bears will consume up to 20,000 calories a day. Please do not provide them with an easy food source. If you have bird feeders out, take them down overnight. Another option is to not start feeding the birds until after the bears have entered torpor. If you encounter a bear, make noise by clapping your hands and yelling, do not run. The bears are here, and we must learn to live with them. Please report any bear conflicts to the Pennsylvania Game Commission (814)643-1831, or Marysville Police Department (717)957-2616.

Ordinance Reminders

§10-102. Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation Unlawful and a Nuisance Under Certain Conditions.

No person, owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Marysville, shall permit any grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed a height of 6 inches, or to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor or to conceal any filthy deposit or to create or produce pollen. Any grass, weeds or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of this Section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough. (Ord. 222, 1/8/1968, §2)

§10-103. Responsibility for Removing, Trimming or Cutting Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation.

The owner of any premises, as to vacant premises or premises occupied by the owner, and the occupant thereof, in case of premises occupied by other than the owner thereof, shall remove, trim or cut all grass, weeds or other vegetation growing or remaining upon such premises in violation of any of the provisions of §10-102. (Ord. 222, 1/8/1968, §3)

§21-206. Duty of Property Owners Following Notice to Construct, Reconstruct, or Repair Sidewalk and/or Curb.

When the Borough Council shall order a sidewalk and/or curb to be constructed or reconstructed upon or along any street in the Borough by and at the expense of the owner of the abutting property, the Council shall notify the owner of such property to complete the construction or reconstruction of the same, in strict conformity with the Borough specifications therefore, within 30 days after such notice. When the Borough shall order a sidewalk and/or curb to be repaired upon or along any street in the Borough by and at the expense of the owner of the abutting property, the Council shall notify the owner of such property to complete the repair of the same within 30 days after such notice, such work or repair to be done in the manner and to the extent specified in such notice and in strict conformity with the provisions of such notice. Any failure, refusal or neglect of such property owner to complete such work in conformity with specifications, within the said time limit, shall give the Borough authority to proceed under § 1805 of the Borough Code of 1966 to do, complete or rectify the said work and to collect the cost thereof, plus 10% from such property owner in default. (Ord.226, 1/8/1968, §1; as amended by Ord. 289, 12/2/1974, §1)

§20-104. Pre-collection Practices Refuse Collection

Containers shall be of metal or plastic and shall not exceed 32 gallons in capacity and shall be of such size as can be handled easily by one man. The maximum weight of a filled container shall not exceed 40 pounds. Plastic trash bags may be used to transport the refuse to the curb on the day of collection, but shall not be allowed to remain outside of the metal or plastic cans for more than 12 hours prior to the day of collection if they contain garbage. §20-202. Penalties. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. (Ord. 266, 12/26/1972, §2; as amended by Ord. 553, 5/10/2004, §1)

Street Sweeping

When your street is scheduled for sweeping please be advised that your vehicle must be removed from the street between the hours of 7:00am to 3:00pm. Any vehicle not removed could result in a parking ticket or towing of your vehicle. The street sweeping will be done once a month. Please see below the street sweeping schedule:

Bonnie Hammaker just wanted to clarify what happened with the pool. Bonnie went down to the pump house to backwash. When she opened the door water was spraying everywhere. She quickly turned off the pump and called Ken Miller from the borough. He came down to look at it and called Larry our pool guy. Larry came and looked at it and they ordered a new part. This is an old part and they do not carry it in stock. **The "pump" did not break down, a part did.** The pump is fine. When the part comes in Larry and Ken will fix it and winterize the pool.

Even though we had to close three days early, this as a blessing. First of all this could have happened in the beginning of the season and our summer would have been a disaster. Secondly, this could have happened in the middle of the summer, and it would have been a disaster. Third, if Bonnie had not gone down when she did, the pool would probably be closed permanently. There are all kinds of ways to look at this as a bad thing if you choose to. **We had a good summer. Lots of nice comments, people supporting the pool and the community embracing it.** I don't think three days closing early should define how the season went. There are some things that are just not in our control and this was one of them. These are the kinds of things that will continue to happen and we will fix them as they arise. Parts have broken in the past and they will continue to break in the future. This is why we formed the Foundation.

We would like to reassure the pool will be reopening next year and that this was a minor repair, not a major disaster.

We would like to say "Thank You" to everyone for their support and understanding during our first season of overseeing some of the pool operations.






