

**BOROUGH OF MARYSVILLE**  
**Council Minutes**  
**October 12, 2015**  
**7:30 PM**

President Steve Copp called the council meeting to order at 7:30pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Reverend Kauffman shared the invocation.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to approve the minutes, financial statement for September 2015 and pay the bills.

**Junior Council Person**

Hannah Murphy was sworn in as our new Junior Council for the 2015 and 2016 school year.

**Public Comment**

Marcia Marburger and Dave Marburger of 411 Lansvale Street have concerns with the tri-axil dump trucks coming up Lansvale Street and Broad Street. The street signs state no three (3) axil or more are prohibited on streets without a permit. She presented a time log of the tri-axil dump trucks and the excavator being brought using Lansvale Street and Broad Street to the Borough Manager, Scott Weaver. Dave said the road is buckling in front of their house. He is concerned about the lateral breaking and they would be responsible to repair the lateral at the expense of the owner receiving free fill and free excavation.

The owner of the private road by the cemetery said they were receiving free fill and free excavation to put a new road. The tri-axil dump trucks are using Lansvale Street and Broad Street from 8:00pm until 5:00am in the morning. There are no permits at all.

Paul Rudy of Perry County Commissioners said he was up for reelection and to consider voting for him on November 3, 2015. He decided to run a second term to finish what he has started.

**Engineer's Report**

Scott Weaver reported paving will take place the third week of October 2015 for Elizabeth Street from South Main Street to Susquehanna Street, Center Street from Jacob Street to Weaver Street, Jacob Street from South Main Street to Center Street, Weaver Street from North Main Street to

Center Street, Weaver Street from North Main Street to Center Street and leveling course for Funk Street from Verbeke Street to State Road.

#### PennVest Loan

Scott Weaver said we are waiting for PennVest to close.

#### How Insurance will work for truck

Scott will provide the insurance information regarding the truck at the November 9, 2015 council meeting.

#### Fire Tax

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Alexandria Snyder and approved unanimously to add 1/10<sup>th</sup> of a mill for a fire tax to be provided to the Marysville Fire Company.

#### Speed Bumps

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Dave Magee with a roll call vote with four nays and three yeas votes not to put the speed bumps down as a test run prior to the 11/15 project. There are a lot of children running around on the street.

#### Ambulance Funding – Tabled

#### Rock Wall Repair

A motion made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to have Solicitor Dan Altland prepare a maintenance agreement between the Borough of Marysville and Marysville Lions Club to be able to continue with the repair of the rock wall along Cassell Street. President Stephen Copp will sign the agreement.

An amendment made to the motion is to have Vice-President, Gary Perry sign the agreement due to Stephen Copp signing for the Marysville Lions Club.

### **New Business**

#### Tires for the 2013 Dump Truck

A motion was made Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to purchase six) Good Year tires for the 2013 dump truck this includes a spare rim and tire at a purchase price of \$1,989.80.

#### Computer for Kim

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to have Kim's computer replaced due to the network card going out at a cost up to \$1,600.00.

#### Muni-Link Billing System

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Dave Magee and approved unanimously to purchase the Muni-Link billing system from Link Computer Corporation.

### Ambulance Funding – Tabled

#### Pumps for Pump Station One (two @ \$2,900.00 = \$5,800.00)

A motion was made by David Magee, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to purchase two pumps for pump station one (Liberty LSGX202-RE 2HP 208-230V Retro-fit System for E/One Grinder Package) at a cost of \$2,900.00 each.

#### Advertise 2016 Proposed Budget

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to advertise the 2016 Proposed Budget.

#### Sludge Pump

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to repair sludge pump up to \$2,500.00 if the cost is more than \$2,500.00 to purchase a new sludge pump up to \$4,200.00.
