Junior Council Report on file

Public Comment

Robert Martz of 514 Lansvale Street had questions regarding the sewer and paving on Lansvale Street. Are we going to pave it this year and in a couple of years dig the road back up? Scott said the money received by Mussie Tilahun Company will allow the borough to patch the worst areas on Lansvale Street from 11/15 to Stephens.

Is UGI planning on putting gas lines in? Scott said there is no chance of UGI putting gas lines through Marysville Borough.

Dave Magee asked UGI Corporation about putting gas lines throughout the borough while the sewer project was being done. UGI Corporation had no plan of putting gas lines throughout Marysville Borough.

Engineering Report

Pennoni Associates announced Redrock Construction, Inc. was awarded the bid for demolition of the blue building located at 114 Valley Street for the cost of \$12,650.00.

Pennoni provided a quote for the Pre-Demolition Building Survey, including Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) and Lead Based Paint (LBP) investigations and Hazardous Materials Assessment proposal for 114 Valley Street structure for the cost of \$3,225.00.

Scott reported the PennVest loan is still pending for closure. Scott indicated we are still waiting on signatures.

Security Camera

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to purchase the security camera system. The cost of the security camera system may increase since an updated quote was not requested; however the increase would be due to material costs.

Award Bid for Blue Building at 114 Valley Street

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to award Redrock Construction, Inc, of P.O. Box 150 Mifflintown, PA 17059 the bid for 114 Valley Street Demolition Project, Contract 2015-01 for the cost of \$12,650.00.

Sanitary Sewer Line Cleaning

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to accept the proposal of \$4,640.00 from Utility Services Group to clean the sanitary sewer line from Ridgeview Drive, Park Drive and part of Kings Highway.

Salt Spreader for New Truck

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to purchase a new salt spreader for the new 2015 Ford F-350 truck from Russ's Auto and Trailer Sales, LLC of 117 N. Enola Road, Enola, PA for a cost of \$4,248.00.

Rescind Motion for Old Truck (Ford, F250)

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Alexandria Snyder and approved unanimously to rescind the motion for bid of the old Ford F250 truck and approve to have Scott put a bid out for the old truck (Ford, F250) including the plow and salt spreader with a reserve.
