Engineering Report

Scott informed council the work at Ron Keeley's property is completed and is waiting on a release letter from Attorney Bill Dissinger. Dave Magee asked why the borough paid for the work done at Ron Keeley's property. Scott said Wexcon will be billed for the work.

Old Business:

Zoning Ordinance

The Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance was sent to Solicitor Dan Altland for his review and comments.

Generators and 200 AMP Service

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Lance Barthel approved with one nay vote from Lance Barthel to purchase the generator for the borough building at a cost of \$6,922.00, upgrade the borough office to a 200 AMP service at a cost of \$700.00 and to purchase a generator for the Marysville/Rye Senior Center at a cost of \$6,996.58 with the agreement the Senior Center will give the borough their current generator and forego their 2015 contribution. Dave asked Scott to contact Solicitor Altland to see is a written agreement will need to be signed with the Senior Center.

Rockville Estates

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Gary Perry approved with one nay vote from Dave Magee to approve Rockville Estates request per Pennoni's comments and Solicitor Altland's request changes to be recorded.

New Business:

Adam Shope/Borough Road Ways

Adam Shope of 607 Susquehanna Street said he has lived in the borough for 12 years and is glad to see we have a Police Department with two good officers that work hard and is happy so see them out on patrol.

Adam informed council that he has called the borough office to speak with Manager Weaver at least 30 times in the last three years concerning his street not having the leaves picked up, street sweeping and snow plowing being done. Adam said he is getting frustrated and is tired of hearing excuse after excuse why this is not being taken care of. Scott said he would street sweep the area next month to make sure it's done properly. Dave Magee asked Scott to put this on the Streets Committee Agenda for October.

Approval of Arbitration Decision

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Larry Little to approve unanimously to approve the Arbitration Decision. Scott said he is waiting on the settlement paperwork for the signatures. Scott said the amount was \$25,000.00 with payroll taxes being deducted and the check was mailed to Attorney Tony Sherr.

File Cabinets

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to sell the borough's file cabinets for \$10.00 each and use the money to purchase shelving.

George Vazquez (blue building) Half Tax \$1,150.00

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to pay half of the school taxes in the amount of \$1,150.00. Scott said we would have to pay for this out of the general fund and get reimbursed when we receive the grant money.

Minimum Municipal Obligation (MMO)

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to approve the Minimum Municipal Obligation (MMO).

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to have Trick or Treat on Thursday, October 30, 2014 from 6:00pm – 8:00pm.
