A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Sherree Knight and unanimously approved to appoint Stephen Copp to the vacant council seat. Mayor Troutman swore in Stephen Copp.

A motion was made by Sherree Knight, seconded by John Edkin and unanimously approved to appoint Ann Simonetti as Vice President.

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Allen Metzger and unanimously approved with the offered amendments to all September minutes and not paying Lyle Signs, Inc. invoice for the Brake Retarder signs (\$221.30) until the ordinance is in place for Brake Retarder.

Public Comment:

Patti Copp announced Wesley United Methodist Church is planning an October Fest on October 27, 2011 and may be having a hayride at 6:00pm. Their plan is to come down Sylvan Street, Maple Avenue and back up Linden Avenue. Council did not see a problem with the hayride route. Patti Copp will notify the borough by 10/22/2011 if they decide to have the hayride. The Police Chief stated this is allowed by the vehicle code.

Engineer's Report:

Ron Brown gave an update on the storm/sewer separation project. United Water is planning on putting a new water line through the underpass. This will be put out to bid by United Water to complete the work and the borough will need to get the right-a-way permit from Norfolk Southern. There are still a lot of details to be worked out. The PennVest application will be completed and uploaded by November 4, 2011. We now have a tentative schedule for the project. The storm/sewer separation project will be advertised in the Patriot-News. The

borough would like to have a pre-bid meeting by 12/7/2011 and open bids by 1/9/2012. A letter needs prepared and sent to DEP for approval of the Categorical Exclusion.

OLD BUSINESS:

Zoning Ordinance - tabled.

904 Performance Recycling Grant – Scott submitted the recycling grant on 10/5/2011.

Pine Tree Removal - A bill was sent to HUD for the tree removal and labor. Scott will give Dan a copy of the letter that was sent to HUD. According to Attorney Dan Altland a lien will need to be placed on the property for the tree removal and labor.

Officer Richards to Test for Corporal – Sent to Finance Committee.

Brian Webster announced a citizen donated a pump to the fire company. The chicken barbeques are done for the year and the fire company will start selling Christmas trees the Saturday after Thanksgiving.
