March 10, 2014

President Steve Copp called the council meeting to order at 7:30pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Reverend Kauffman shared the invocation.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to approve the consent items.

Engineering Report

Scott Weaver said Pennoni Associates worked on the road program.

Pennoni Associates and Scott Weaver will look at the sidewalks and curbs once the snow melts.

Scott said the Chapter 94 has been completed in house, in turned, save the borough money. Most municipalities have their engineers complete the Chapter 94. The Chapter 94 will be reviewed by Pennoni Associates prior to being submitted to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

Deb Troutman introduced Police Officer, Jason Meyer's to council. Council welcomed Jason. Jason Meyer's thanked council for the opportunity to serve Marysville Borough as police officer.

Old Business:

Zoning Ordinance – Connie continues to work with Stephanie Stoner on the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance.

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to have Tara Hostetler of New Cumberland to carpet the police station at a cost of \$3,239.00. Council did not go with the cheapest; but went with Tara Hostetler which offered to dispose of all debris of the job.

New Business:

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously with the recommendation of planning commission to appoint Anson Seeno to have a seat on planning commission.

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Dave Magee and approved unanimously to advertise the special meeting for Monday, May 5, 2014 at 6:30pm. Council would like to hear what residents would like to see in the next five to ten years. This will be a goals oriented workshop. The goals oriented workshop will be held at the Marysville Fire House.

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to award Pennsy Supply, Inc with the 2014 Road Program with Park Drive, Funk Alley, two locations at Sadler and Elizabeth Street (area of 328 South Main Street) added for a total of \$328,214.89 give or take 10%. Council would like to take \$175,000.00 from liquid fuels and the remaining from the general fund.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to approve the pool salaries. Steve and Allen discussed the pool salaries and do not feel the pay is adequate. Council agreed to revisit the pool salaries after June 2014, once we see the number of memberships received for the pool.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to purchase the M1-AA-15 core drill rig plus bit at a cost of \$975.00. This will allow and help the maintenance staff to drill holes through the concrete for signs.

Gary Perry thanked everyone for their help at the Valentine's Dinner. There was a profit of \$386.64 made from the dinner.

Media Questions:

Sean Sauro of the Perry County Times asked about the Goals Oriented Workshop being held on May 5, 2014. Steve said council would like to hear from residents what they would like to see in the next five to ten years in the borough.

Sean also questioned about the road program.

Scott said to call or e-mail him and he would answer all questions Sean would have.

Correspondence:

There is still time register for the 103rd Pennsylvania State Association of Borough's annual conference and exhibition, schedule for April 6-9, 2014 at the Penn State Conference Center in State College.

Yingst Homes presented the phasing schedule for Rockville Estates. Phase I has been submitted. The phases and submission dates are as follows; Phase II, (April 30, 2018), phase III (April 30, 2023), Phase III, (April 30, 2028), phase IV, (April 30, 2028) and phase V, (April 30, 2032).

Council entered into executive session at 8:00pm to discuss personnel issues. The executive session ended at 8:15pm.

A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and not approved with five nay votes and 2 yea votes to continue with the Capital Region COG. Council requested Scott to provide the benefits of staying with the Capital Region COG at the next council meeting.

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to add an additional eight (8) hours per a week or a maximum of 32 hours per a week for part-time police officer.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Dave Magee and approved unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 8:26pm.
