

BOROUGH OF MARYSVILLE
Council Minutes
August 12, 2013
7:30 PM

President Steve Copp called the council meeting to order at 7:33pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Reverend Kauffman shared the invocation.

Question by Roger Barrick on the payables included the Chemung Supply for manhole risers. Wouldn't this be part of the sewer project? Scott answered the borough had to purchase the manhole risers because manhole risers are not covered by the sewer project funding as it is part of the paving.

Question by Dave Magee where does the police and pool employees workers comp show? Connie answered it is included in payroll.

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to approve the consent items.

Public Comment:

John Edkin of 337 Valley Street had concerns with the ADA ramp at Walnut Street and 11/15. Dave Magee agreed with John. Scott will contact Greg Rogalski of Pennoni Associates to address the ADA ramp design at Walnut Street and 11/15.

Frank Boyer of 316 South State Road asked if the ordinance being adopted tonight could be retroactive for the lateral replacement at the corner of Lansvale Street and 11/15. The water company replaced the water line at the corner of Lansvale Street and 11/15. There is still a dip in the road across Lansvale. Council requested Scott check with the Solicitor, Dan Altland and with the Engineer, Pennoni Associates.

Engineering Report

Scott Weaver said milling of the roads will start August 19, 2013 and paving will begin on August 26, 2013.

Scott Weaver, Pennsy Supply, Wexcon Inc., McNaughton Paving and Pennoni Associates will be meeting to discuss the milling and paving process this week.

A final walk through will be completed after paving is completed.

Ann Simonetti asked if all work has been completed at Doris Kocher's property at 222 Chestnut Street. Scott said we will need to reseed some places in the yard, but the cables and fascia have been reattached.

Old Business:

Zoning Ordinance – Connie continues to work with Stephanie Stoner.

The Sewer Main repair at Kings Highway will be completed the latter part of August 2013.

Aron Starnowsky started the Eagle Scout project for the trail to the Lions Club Park. Scott said the fire company will assist to cut trees on August 26, 2013, and then they will be able to start to replace the rail.

Scott has not heard anything from Chase Delancey regarding his Eagle Scout project at the overlook area in the borough.

The borough is awaiting a reply from PennDOT regarding the no-right-turn-on-red at Valley Street and 11/15.

Steve Copp said there is no Lions Club meeting in August 2013. Allen Metzger will plan to attend the September 2013 board meeting with the Marysville Lions Club to discuss the pool pump house invoice.

Ann Simonetti asked Scott if the electric inspection was completed for the pool. Scott said Ken of Building Inspection Underwriters, Inc. did inspections for the electric and the pavilion at the pool. Ken will need to see the engineering drawings for the pavilion and then the inspections will be completed.

New Business:

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Dave Magee, and approved unanimously to approve a reciprocal agreement to credit for local tax paid owed to another state (and therefore allow a refund).

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Roger Barrick and approved unanimously to adopt the ordinance amending Chapter 18, Part 3 sewer system.

Marysville Lions Club will host Community Day on September 14, 2013. President Steve Copp of the Marysville Lions Club is asking for a donation from the Borough of Marysville. A motion was made by Dave Magee, seconded by Allen Metzger and unanimously approved with one abstention to donate \$300.00 toward Community Day. There will be no alcohol served at Community Day.

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Dave Magee and approved unanimously to pay the outstanding invoice from Pinnacle Health for Blood Alcohol content tests done on suspects by the police department of \$6,548.74, and future invoices will be paid in full when received.

A motion was made by Sherree Knight, seconded by Ann Simonetti and approved unanimously to reimburse mileage for Mayor Troutman to attend the Mayors' conference. For future

overnight use, the manager will determine if the borough car can be used. When the borough car is available, and, if the user chooses to not use it, mileage reimbursement will not be paid.

A motion was made by Roger Barrick, seconded by Ann Simonetti and approved unanimously to use Kline's for our interceptor cleaning for \$5,900.00.

A motion was made by Sherree Knight, seconded by Roger Barrick and approved unanimously to table the union contract until the September 9, 2013 council meeting. Scott should distribute copies to Borough Council upon receipt from the labor attorney.

A motion was made by Ann Simonetti, seconded by Dave Magee and approved unanimously to switch to National Medical Service for Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) lab testing and to authorize purchase of a refrigerator along with a lock to secure the blood samples in the police department.

Dave Magee said the borough has been awarded \$61,127.00 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to use toward the Marysville Borough Municipal parking lot along South Main Street and to purchase a building.

The Asset Management program was referred to the Sewer and Finance Committee meetings.

Brian Webster of the Marysville Fire Company announced their chicken barbeque are held the second Saturday of the month at Rockville Square.

Committee Reports

Sherree shared upcoming events planned by the Parks & Rec Committee.

Marysville Borough Parks and Recreation give back event is August 14, 013 from 11:00am to 10:00pm at the Chili's in Mechanicsburg. Chili's will donate 10% of the sales back to the Marysville Borough Parks and Recreation.

October 12, 2013 Finger Lakes winery and dinner trip.

October 21, 2013 Halloween parade will be held with a rain date of October 28, 2013. They will start staging at 5:30pm at the Mason's Lodge.

December 7, 2013 New York City bus trip "Day on Your Own"

The Parks and Recreation Planning meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 13, 2013 at 5:00pm in the council chambers.

Media Questions:

Kara Newhouse of the Duncannon Record asked a few questions.

What is an interceptor? Scott explained the interceptor runs along the properties along the river.

What was the mileage reimbursement for? The mileage reimbursement was for Mayor Deb Troutman to attend the Mayors' conference.

What is the outstanding invoice for Pinnacle Health? It was for Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) and drug testing of suspects. The invoice was most likely paid but the remuneration was misallocated. Aaron has been working with Kim to better identify the line item.

The Perry County Chamber of Commerce thanked the Marysville Borough for our renewal of partnering to make Perry County an even greater place to live, work and play.
