Brian Webster announced the Marysville Fire Company now sponsors two Community Aid boxes located at the Scale House and Rockville Center. They also give out \$25.00 gift certificate cards quarterly to be used if a family is in need of clothing in case of a fire.

The Fire Company is able to apply for a \$5,000.00 grant a year.

The Community Aid boxes do not need to be in the borough.
