Council Minutes
May 9, 2016

President Steve Copp called the council meeting to order at 7:30pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Pastor Parker shared the invocation.

A motion was made by Allen Metzger, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to approve the minutes for April 11, 2016, approve financial statement for April 2016 and pay the bills.

Junior Council – Vacant seat

Public Comment

Shawn Griffith of 77 North Main Street asked why the speed bumps were put in. The speed bumps are backing up traffic because you have to almost stop to go over the speed bumps. Shawn feels the speed bumps are creating hazard. Cars are not making a complete stop at the stop sign on South Main Street at the subway. It is very difficult to make a left hand turn onto North Main Street.

Rose Wolfe of 412 Myrtle Avenue feels a speed bump is needed for Front Street. Vehicles are flying on Front Street.

Jeanne Hanna-Bentz of 323 Front Street said it is very dangerous getting out of the car on Front Street. She would like to see a speed bump put in front of her house to slow traffic down.

Chief Aaron Richards said the speed bumps are interrupting the flow of traffic and causing traffic to stack up in the subway. He suggested moving two of the speed bumps and putting the speed bumps between Riverside West Pub and the sewer plant.

Engineer's Report

Scott Weaver read the report submitted by Greg Ragolski of Pennoni to Council. The following items were included on the report:

Aerial Mapping

The reduction of the photos into a survey drawing is underway. The mapping associated with the “southern” portion of the flight path encompassing the Park and Ridgeview Drive has been delivered. The remainder of the original scope area is about 75% complete. Pennoni will continue to process the remainder of the original and extra flight areas until complete, which are both anticipated by the end of the month.

Park and Ridgeview Reconstruction

F.T. Kitlinski & Associates completed twenty borings along Park and Ridgeview Drive in late April. The results are the existing pavement section on Ridgeview is inadequate, (less than 3” in most areas), which will likely require full reconstruction of the pavement section, including both a bituminous base course and wearing surface. The existing subgrade below the pavement is the issue on Park Drive, where it appears that subgrade is very moist in several areas, as well as poorly compacted. Some form of subgrade remediation will be necessary along portions of the road. The results were presented to the Streets Committee at their May meeting and Pennoni is looking to have several cost estimates and phase options prepared next week.

Natural Gas Virtual Pipeline Feasibility Study

The borough received the surveys which were mailed last month and the results generally indicated the residents were not in favor of switching. Pennoni, Borough Engineer will be completing the feasibility study with the information received and have draft report for the June 13, 2016 meeting.

Scott indicated an estimated cost of repairing Park and Ridgeview Drive would be somewhere from \$500,000.00 to \$600,000.00.

New Business

Service Agreement Envirep (\$2,080.00)

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to purchase the Service Agreement from Envirep TLC for the Gorman-Rupp pumping equipment located at Sportsman’s Club PS and Wastewater Treatment Plant PS.

Electronic Recycle – Tabled and sent back to the Finance Committee.

Ordinance Amending (Chapter 15, Part 2, Traffic Regulations and Chapter 15, Part 4. General Parking Regulations)

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to adopt the ordinance amending Chapter, 15, Part 2, Traffic Regulations and Chapter 15, Part 4, General Parking Regulations.

2016 Aerial Mapping (\$41,140.00)

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to pay the bill of \$41,140.00 for the 2016 aerial mapping. Dave Magee asked where the monies were coming from to pay for the aerial mapping. Scott said the monies were coming from PNC Bank for the aerial mapping.

Sale of the Sewer Plant

A motion was made by Alexandria Snyder, seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to explore the option for the sale of the sewer plant.

Speed Bumps on South Main Street

A motion was made by Lance Barthel, seconded by Alexandria Snyder and approved unanimously to remove the first and third speed bumps from tunnel and install the speed bumps further down on South Main Street at the discretion of Chief, Aaron Richards.

Commission Reports

Fire Company

Scott Weaver read the Fire Report for April. The fire company had the following calls: one tree, one AFA, one transfer, two MVA, two MVA / Fire, one brush fire for a total of seven calls. The fire company had 14 training hours and traveled a total of 76 miles.

Brian Webster said the Marysville Fire Company participated in the Prom Promise at Susquenita High School.

Brian Webster said the fire company completed their first cleaning outside windows.

Brian Webster said the road closure affected their chicken barbeque and flower sale held the first weekend of May. Marysville Fire Company did not order as much chicken due to the road closure.

The second Saturday in June the Marysville Fire Company will be selling apple dumplings. Orders and money are due by Saturday, June 11, 2016. Apple Dumplings can be picked up after 5:00pm on June 18, 2016 or 12:00pm to 4:00pm on June 19, 2016. The cost is \$4.00 each.

Brian Webster said the Mother's Day flower sale took place the 1st weekend of May. The chicken BBQ will be held on Saturday, May 7, 2016.

Public Comment

Eric Brandberg of 330 Locust Street said he uses South Main Street twice a day. He said to give it some time before jumping into moving the speed bumps from South Main Street.

Lance Barthel and Tosh representing Zeiderelli's Pizza of 210 North State Road asked council to consider closing Chestnut Street after the Speedway entrance to Maple Avenue because they are looking at having a street fair next year. We could possibly ask the Lions Club to use their stands.
