### Financing of Sewer Project-Tabled

Financing of Street Project – Dave Magee stated it would cost 1.1 Million dollars to pave Park Drive and Ridgeview Drive correctly. Finance and Street Committee said to delay the paving until 2018. This would give residents more time to have their curbs repaired and would allow the borough more time to plan financially.

### Road Project for Park and Ridgeview Drive

Dave said we are looking to apply a skim coat from 115 to 222 Ridgeview Drive, Cassell Street Biting Alley and right before Verbeke Street and to black top the parking lot on Mill Street.
