Close Bank Accounts (Pennvest, Sewer Money Market, Vehicle Capital Reserves)  
A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to close bank accounts for Pennvest, Sewer Money Market and Vehicle Capital Reserve because the accounts are not being used.

Lease Agreement Norfolk Southern (\$1.00 per Day)  
A motion by Larry Little, seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to sign the lease agreement with Norfolk Southern for a \$1.00 day for Schrader Park.

Furnace in Borough Office (\$8490.00)  
A motion by Allen Metzger seconded by Lance Barthel and approved unanimously to purchase the furnace for \$8,490.00 for the borough office.

Heater/AC for Sewer Plant (\$3,250.00)  
A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to purchase the heater / air condition for sewer plant for \$3,250.00.

Tires for F550 (\$2,116.20) and F350 (\$858.08) Add \$4.00 per tire disposal  
A motion by Larry Little, seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to purchase tires for the F550 at a cost of \$2,116.20 and purchase tires for the F350 at a cost of \$858.00 plus add \$4.00 per a tire for disposal. Scott said he realizes the F350 is only a year old; however the tires were cheap and did not want to plow snow this winter with the original tires.

Advertise 2017 Proposed Budget  
A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Gary Perry and approved unanimously to advertise the 2017 Proposed Budget.

### Pole Building RFP

A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to send out RFP for a 60 X 120 pole building at the borough building.

### Computer for two Police cars

A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Allen Metzger and approved unanimously to purchase two new computers (tablets) /printers not to exceed \$6,000.00 for the two police cars.

### Advertise Tax Collector Percentage Reduction

A motion by Lance Barthel seconded by Larry Little and approved unanimously to advertise amended ordinance to reduce the tax collector percentage from 5% to 3%.
